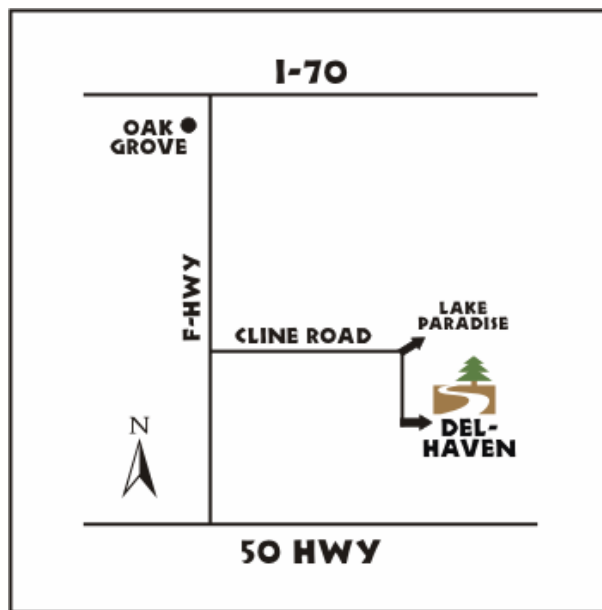

CAMP DEL-HAVEN VOLUNTEER INFORMATION - SUMMER 2010

Background Information

Camp Del-Haven is a non-profit, Christian organization that provides Christ-centered camping for underprivileged children. All of our staff work on a volunteer basis and are committed to sharing the Gospel of the glory of Christ with the children who attend our camp sessions. There is no charge for any child to attend our camp sessions. Del-Haven is a ministry that is supported by individuals and Churches who are also committed to sharing the Gospel with the children who attend Camp Del-Haven.

Camp Del-Haven is located on 40 acres of land in Lone Jack, MO. The grounds are facilitated with a dining hall, chapel, 4 cabins, outdoor shower house, craft cabin, shelter house, and a dormitory with indoor bath facilities. As part of our outdoor program we also have: basketball court, swimming pool, ball field, a small lake, hiking trails, sports equipment of all kind, and campfires that are complete with marshmallows.

The camp program is centered around two daily Bible classes, after meals and before bedtime devotions, and daily Scripture memory. These activities are the focus of our program. Other activities include: nature study, crafts, recreation, special guests, swimming, and lake activities.

Volunteer Requirements

There are a few requirements that must be met by all of our volunteers working with children to assure that we have a committed, well-trained staff who can work within our camp program.

* Must be at least 15 years of age (Unless you are in our LTS [Learning to Serve] Program)

* Make a commitment to be at the entire sessions for which you are available

* Attend required staff training.

* Read and agree to Camp Del-Haven's statement of faith.

* Sign the statement declaring that you have not been accused of or convicted of any form of child abuse or child endangerment.

* Have a personal testimony of God's saving work in your life.

* Abide by the dress code - Only one piece bathing suits for girls (or swimsuits where the mid-section is covered), shorts must be long enough that they come to your fingertips when your arms are hanging down at your sides, no mid-drift shirts that show the mid-section, and no spaghetti strap tank tops.

* Be willing to serve the Lord

Volunteer Expectations

1. Be present for all required training.
2. Be respectful to other counselors, special guests, and campers.
3. Be willing to do what is asked of you whether it is helping in the kitchen, cleaning up a mess, sitting with a crying camper, etc.
4. Encourage, uplift, and pray for staff and campers.
5. Be present at all activities, including morning staff meetings. An exception will be made if you have been given a break.
6. Make sure that the campers in your cabin are present and on time for all activities and meals.
7. Be certain that every camper leaves with all of their belongings and camp crafts.
8. Help in cabin clean-up after the session is over.
9. Phone use should be done when on your break and limited to what is important and necessary.
10. Be willing to take directions from the Head Counselors. They have many years of experience and are dedicated to the Lord in this ministry.
11. Be prepared to do all that you are scheduled to do ~ Do not give your responsibilities over to someone else. If there is a problem talk with the staff administrator.
12. No "special" relationships among staff members.
13. Do not leave your campers unattended - they must be supervised!
14. All counselors must be in their cabins by 11 P.M.
15. Spend as much time with the campers as possible, know where they are, they are the reason why we are here!
